

STATEMENT ON SEXUAL VIOLENCE AT WESTERN UNIVERSITY

Content Warning: Sexual Violence

We, the York Federation of Students, affirm our support and solidarity with the impacted students at Western University, and all survivors of sexual violence. We remain committed to working towards and advocating for a culture of consent that centres survivors, both within our institutions and in society.

Sexual violence is a widespread problem that continues to bring harm to survivors and post-secondary campuses. Rape culture continues to be prevalent within our society including at post-secondary institutions. The recent incidents at Western University serve as a reminder that the fight against sexual violence and the promotion of consent culture must continue to be prioritized. There is a collective responsibility to ensure that we are all playing an active role in dismantling rape culture and appropriately addressing instances of sexual violence. Survivors deserve to be provided with campus resources that meet their needs.

It is not enough to acknowledge sexual violence and its harmful effects, especially after an incident has occurred. Universities, post-secondary institutions, and the province of Ontario need to be proactive and make consistent efforts to fund, provide education surrounding sexual violence, and provide supports for survivors. This education and support should be led through a lens that truly prioritizes survivors. In addition, conversations surrounding rape culture and sexual violence must be equitable, intersectional, and representative of various communities and identities. Sexual violence and rape culture carry a significant impact, and Ontario universities must do better to address this.
